Apply sticky mud to your bare arm and then create your own woodland camouflage by adding sticks, leaves and other natural materials to the mud. How well can you disguise your arm?






Natural Artists

Why not have a go at making your own mosaic?


It doesn't have to be historical themed - you could make one of your favourite animal or hobby.

Leaf Rubbings

Collect different shaped leaves that have fallen to the ground at Lesnes. Place paper over the leaves and rub over the top of them with crayons or pencils to make leaf rubbings!

Spiderwebs

Find 3 sticks the same size from the woods and tie them together to make a star shape. Attach white wool or string to the sticks and weave them around in a spiral shape to make a spiderweb!





Leaf Collage

Using only leaves you gather from the ground in the woods at Lesnes create a beautiful collage picture. Perhaps your picture could be of the landscape, a tree or an animal.


Fossil Finding



Den Building

Find a spot in Lesnes Abbey's woods and build yourself a den from all natural materials. Remember not to destroy log piles and dismantle the den afterwards. See if you can complete the following challenges:

- Add furniture e.g., benches and seats
- Create a fake campfire from sticks and leaves
- Make it large enough to fit 4+ people inside
- Camouflage it with leaves to blend in
- Build it without gaps to make it waterproof/windproof

Pinecone For<u>ests</u>



Gather a selection of natural materials and find a spot in the woods. Create a treasure map using the materials. Don't forget to add an X to mark your treasure's hiding spot!





Lesnes History Tour

Did you know that the monks would start their first mass at 2am each day and end their final mass after 7pm!






This space would be where the monks would sleep and there was no privacy. The only source of heat would be from the fireplace.

7 This tree was said to be gifted to Lesnes around 1720 by which monarch?

The King wanted to rival the silk production in China and ordered the planting of lots of Black Mulberry trees. The King didn't realise silkworms only eat the leaves on White Mulberry trees so his plan failed.



This courtyard was for exercise, study and work. The monks also grew plants for medicines which they used to treat diseases in the infirmary.





This room has a stone channel and square vat for making beer and ale. Herbs were grown to add flavour. In fact beer was drunk by the monks more than water. Why do you think this was?
